Duration:	Six months preferred but flexible.

The Consortium for Street Children (CSC) is the global network that raises children in street situations voices, promotes their rights and improves their lives. We do this through advocacy, research and network development and have 100+ members working in 130 countries around the world. Our Network comprises members from grassroots organisations, international organisations and researchers.

Specific responsibilities

Research

- Support the Advocacy and Research Manager and Officer in conducting research on the CSC research priorities street-connected children.
- Conduct research on statistics and facts on street-connected children and disseminate findings.
- Support the development of research proposals, concept papers and identification of new research partners and funding opportunities
- Support a research capacity mapping among network members.
- Search for and make existing research/ literature available and accessible to CSC members.
- Update the Global Resource Centre, including the online library.
- Support engagement with the CSC Research Forum.

- Provide ad hoc administrative support to the CSC team including minute taking and co-ordination of meetings; and
